A personal encounter with Jesus Christ really changes a person's life. This encounter first takes place when they meet you and observe your simple testimony of faith through your words and actions. If these potential members do not see Christ in you, why would they want to join a group of men who consider themselves to be the right arm of the Church of Christ! So it is in faith that you will accomplish this work of recruitment and, by so doing, you will evangelize. You will be the living Church, accessible to all. In #114 of his Exhortation, the Pope reminds us that "Being Church means being God's people, in accordance with the great plan of his fatherly love.

This means that we are to be God's leaven in the midst of humanity.

It means proclaiming and bringing God's salvation into our world, which often goes astray and needs to be encouraged, given hope and strengthened on the way. The Church must be a place of mercy freely given, where everyone can feel welcomed, loved, forgiven and encouraged to live the good life of the Gospel."

Dear Knights, I sincerely hope you will take this message to heart so as to produce a real renewal in the Church and in our Order. Christ needs you and show His trust in you by entrusting His life and His mission to you. Let's ask the Holy Spirit for His assistance every day. He will help us in all our weaknesses and shortcomings. Let's go forward with faith and hope!

We have just finished a wonderful strong month of June with new members going through their first degree, and let's keep this going so that together we can achieve the best numbers in membership in years.

After our return from the Supreme Convention in Philadelphia, it was made very clear to us how important membership is to the Order. For the past decade, Ontario and the other Canadian jurisdictions have been in a declining state. In reality, the death rate in Ontario of our members increases every year, suspensions are starting to flatten out and I want to thank the councils for their efforts with retention. The State Board, the State Team along with your Districts Deputies want to assist you in reaching your Membership Quota. This is the best way to secure the future of the Knights in Ontario.

Supreme Knight, Carl Anderson, indicated to the ten Canadian jurisdictions his fear, that if we cannot start to replace our members that leave us, we might not have an organisation in 5, 10 or 15 years from now. Let's be pro-active, let's not abandoned what many of our past members have worked so hard to start. Ontario needs the Knights of Columbus, and a Knight of Columbus that is strong and active. How can we get there? During my Installation in New Haven in early June, Supreme Knight and his Board provided tools so we can be more effective in our endeavors. After much calculation, they have given us some State Quotas, if we are able to achieve them, we will end up in a positive membership growth.

The Star Council award is the most rewarding recognition a council can achieve. How important is it to be recognized for a job well done? I am sure when you leave your house to go to work every day, you are counting on receiving a pay check at the end of the week? Well the Star Council is the equivalent. Councils spend time recruiting, organizing important programs to help improve our visibility in our communities; this represents hours and hours of volunteer work.

How about reporting these many activities that you are already doing? How about filing the Supreme reports that they need to better assist you during the year? We have a great State Team this year that only wants your success. We are there to help, please, just ask and we will help you. I believe we can in Ontario have at least 100 Star Councils out of our 530+ councils.

Recruitment is something we should do 365 days a year. It does not matter if you are in Church or getting groceries, or even having an oil change, we are always Knights, and recruiting can happen anywhere.

Frères Chevaliers,

Quel honneur et aussi quel privilège pour moi que de pouvoir vous servir à titre de Député d'État pour l'année fraternelle 2015-2016. Toute une année nous attend! Nous venons juste de finir le mois de juin de façon superbe avec de nouveaux membres qui ont fait leur 1er degré, et nous continuons de cette façon afin que tous ensemble nous puissions accomplir les meilleurs résultats d'adhésion de membres, depuis des années.

Lors du Congrès Suprême, à Philadelphie, on nous a clairement rappelé combien important est l'adhésion de nouveaux membres pour l'Ordre. Lors de la dernière décennie, l'Ontario et les autres juridictions canadiennes ont été en déclin. Le Chevalier Suprême, Carl Anderson, a exprimé aux dix juridictions canadiennes sa crainte que si nous ne pouvons commencer à remplacer nos membres qui quittent, nous pourrions ne plus avoir une organisation dans cinq, dix, ou quinze ans de maintenant. Soyons pro actifs, n'abandonnons pas ce que plusieurs de nos membres de la première heure, ont travaillé si fort à établir. L'Ontario a besoin de Chevaliers de Colomb forts et actifs.

Comment pouvons-nous atteindre ce but? Lors de mon installation à New Haven, au début de juin, le Chevalier Suprême et son Conseil ont fourni des outils pour que nous puissions être plus efficaces avec nos projets. Après divers calculs, ils nous ont octroyé des quotas pour nos juridictions. Si nous sommes capables de les atteindre, nous terminerons avec une croissance positive de l'adhésion des membres.

You will, no doubt, recall that a resolution was made (and it was defeated) to increase the per capita for each Council.

Defeat of this motion meant that your State Board Executive had to "go back to the drawing board" in an attempt figure ways to keep giving you the service you need at the most lowest cost possible.

And now, to discover that many councils still owe per capita and other monies to State.

You must understand that the State Board, unlike the local Councils and Assemblies, does not have the ability to run dinner dances, communion breakfasts, picnics, barbeques and so forth in order to raise the necessary capital to operate. We rely on per capita income and a small portion of the revenue from the State Lottery in order to "keep the doors open".

I am therefore appealing to you, Worthy Grand Knights, to ensure that the Councils which you lead are diligent in submitting their per capita levy in a timely manner.

The future of our Order in Ontario is in your hands.

As the State Treasurer I would like to see the Knights of Columbus in Ontario flourish and I urge you my Brothers to help make this happen.

God bless us all as we continue to do His work.

The Knights of Columbus are currently implementing a Safe Environment Program. The highest priority of the Knights, at all levels, is the safety and well-being of the young people we serve through our programs and activities.

To provide a consistent and effective training program the Supreme Council has partnered with Praesidium, an international leader in abuse risk management. Praesidium has three decades of experience helping thousands of organizations protect youth and vulnerable adults in their care. Information on this organization is available from their web site: http://website.praesidiuminc.com

Grand Knights, Faithful Navigators, youth directors, Columbian Squires chairmen, Squires chief counsellors and Squires committee counsellors will be required to complete Praesidium Armatus© youth protection training.

The training helps youth leaders identify risks and create a safe environment in which to conduct youth programs. There is no cost for this training: all costs are covered by the Knights of Columbus. If they haven't already, they will be contacted over the next few months with more information. Many of our officers and youth leaders have already received training or background checks by diocesan or municipal organizations and may be wondering if this exempts them from the Safe Environment Program. It does not.

The program offered by the Knights is specific to our Order and may provide additional information not covered by other programs.

It is also good to review those elements of the training that may be in common with other programs. The protection of our youth is worth it.

As State Advocate it is my job to help members and councils interpret the laws and rules of our Order. Please contact me if you have any questions or concerns.

I have already participated in several meetings and teleconferences with the State Board and I am encouraged by the exchange of ideas as well as by everyone's commitment to the betterment of the Knights of Columbus. Clearly there is a healthy cross section of experience in the private and public sector as well as the Knights of Columbus.

My position as State Warden also came with several other portfolios that I would like to take this opportunity to share with you.

Squires:

Squire Circles teaches the young men between the ages of 10 to 18 how to take responsibility for their actions. This leadership program also provides growth in areas such as decision making, delegation of responsibility, public speaking, public relations, record-keeping, financial responsibility, and program promotion.

Squires are also involved in promoting vocations, marching in defense of unborn life, feeding the hungry, clothing the poor, supporting Special Olympics and promoting Catholic education, among countless other activities. In other words, Squires have a direct impact on Canadian society.

Across the Globe, Columbian Squires have more than 1,300 circles with nearly 25,000 Catholic youth members in Canada, the United States, the Philippines, Mexico, Puerto Rico and Guam. These numbers and their presence around the globe suggest they are making a difference on many levels.

I wanted to stress these three levels and show you how valuable our Squires are to the Knights of Columbus because we need your help to find more of those young men.

In Ontario, we have 28 active Circles with 600 active Squires and 120 Knights volunteering as Counsellors.

Brothers, I believe that the Squires are fulfilling their duty to the Church, the Knights of Columbus in a manner that is faithful to the ideals of Father Michael J. McGivney. Seen from this perspective I wish to reiterate what our current State Deputy has said: I challenge every District Deputy, Grand Knight, Council Officer and member to take a closer look at this program."

So let us never forget that – while we may have a moral obligation to ensure that every Catholic Man is a member of the Knights of Columbus! This means that we need to be outspoken.

This means we need to be visible. This means we need to increase awareness about the great work we do. It also means we need to support the Columbian Squires thereby ensuring that we are making a positive impact in our communities for all ages. The Father McGivney Guild:

At the last District Deputy meeting, I made an appeal to all DDs present to register and I am pleased to report that virtually everyone present agreed to register for this worthy cause. The response was truly amazing and is a clear validation of this cause.

It is worth repeating that the more members that belong to the guild – including spouses, children, relatives, friends and neighbours – the greater the support for Father McGivney's cause for canonization. With this support the Pope might elevate him to Sainthood. So let's show our support and register to the Guild – which is free!

R.E.S.P.E.C.T.

What R.E.S.P.E.C.T. means to you?

This year, our State Deputy, has selected a new acronym for the Ontario State : R.E.S.P.E.C.T. We want all of Ontario leaders and members to reflect on what R.E.S.P.E.C.T. means to them.

R = *Relationships*

We need to build a strong relationship with our members based on mutual respect and support. Let's encourage our councils to stop only using their emails and start calling their members on a regular basis. Not just when they need a favor. So when they call, the member will not block the call or ignore it all together. By building strong relationships we will bond and truly understand the meaning of being a brother Knight.

E = Equality

No matter who you are or at what level you are in the Order, everyone counts. It can be the cleaning lady, the secretary or the Supreme Knight. We all deserve to be respected. Talk to the members that are always alone and try to get them more involved. If you see cliques you should try to close them down. Last thing you should do is join them.

S = Support our Members

Make sure your members are treated fairly, are given the resources needed to do their jobs that barriers are removed, and recognition is given for a job well done. When they succeed, tell everyone. Ontario has 40 Star Councils for 2014-15

Based on the list of Star Councils, published recently in Knightline, Ontario ended the fraternal year 2014-15 with 40 Star Councils. This is good news, compared to the 19 Star Councils during the 2013-14 fraternal year.

It appears that Ontario still has some catch up to do, to be within the world average. However, we need to recognize the large increase in 2014-15 (total of 40 Star Councils) compared to the previous year 2013-14 (total of 19 Star Councils).

In one year the total # of Star Councils more than double. If we follow this trend, in 2015-16 Ontario could end up with 80+ Star Councils.

The Toronto East Diocesan Zone was a leader in Ontario as they performed very well. 16% of their councils achieved Star Council status, slightly above the world average. Toronto East was the leader in Ontario among the 12 Diocesan Zones/Associations.

For the Toronto East Zone, this did not happen overnight but was the result of progressive improvements over a 3-year period: 2011-12 = 1 Star Council; 2012-13 = 3 Star Councils; 2013-14 = 5 Star Councils; 2014-15 = 9 Star Councils. During the last year 2014-15 the Membership and Insurance quotas of all Councils in Ontario were tracked on a monthly basis. As of June 2015 there were 54 "candidate" Councils for Star Awards.

The "gap" between the 54 "candidate" Councils and the 40 actual Star Councils is thought provoking and presents an opportunity. We believe that the key to success of achieving Star Council is Training and assistance on how to complete the key Forms that are part of the qualification of Star Council.

Working closely with Fraternal Benefits Advisors throughout the Membership recruitment drives is another key success factor.

How rewarding is the Star Council award recognizing the many efforts of the members of a Council. Therefore, let's all aim for the Star Council award, and you will see what I mean!
