Featured Program

COVID Recovery Plan Program

For every \$500 or 1,000 pounds of food donated, the Supreme Council will refund \$100 back to the council – up to a maximum of \$500 per council per fraternal year.

Featured Program Requirement – one of the above & contribute a minimum of 100 total man-hours in preparation/distribution/service of meals.

Report activity and apply for the refund using the Food for Families Refund Application (#10057).

Family Prayer Night

Featured Program COVID Recovery Plan Program

Family Prayer Night is an opportunity for children to be exposed to 'regular people living their faith in a casual setting'.

Families of council members, as well as other Catholic families within the parish and community, will gather for prayer, dinner/games, and fellowship.

Featured Program Requirements; organize a minimum of four Family Prayer Nights, one for each quarter of the year.

Any family oriented, social gathering, that is begun & concluded with a prayer, qualifies — as a 'Family Prayer Night'.

Family Fully Alive

Featured Program

The Family Fully Alive monthly devotions are a way councils can support the growth of holy and loving families in the Church.

The program provides monthly themes, scripture verses and activities. Through prayer and reflection, each family has the opportunity to grow in holiness together.

This is a flexible program that can be started at any time of the year and continues year-round.

Featured Program Requirements - distribute and actively promote the use of the Family Fully Alive Booklets (#10162).

Keep Christ in Christmas

ANY activity that involves Christ & Christmas in their proper context

- Journey to the Inn
- Light Up for Christ
- Crèche or Advent Wreath Blessing
- Christmas Poster Contest

These activities are centered on the example of the Holy Family and the Nativity of Our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ.

Activities include whatever efforts best suit the parish and community of a particular council and do not need to originate from the Supreme Council.

Consecration to the Holy Family

To help families live out the joy of Christ, families will come together to consecrate themselves under the protection of the Holy Family. In this prayer, we ask for the aid or intercession of the perfect son Jesus Christ, Mary the perfect mother, and Joseph who is a model for every father.

Good Friday Family Promotion

GLOBAL WHEELCHAIR MISSION

Councils are required to donate the equivalent of 10 wheelchairs at \$195 per chair to the Canadian Wheelchair Foundation, by raising funds through council, parish or community activities. Report activity using the online Program Report Form (#10784).

Community Featured Programs

HABITAT FOR HUMANITY

Councils are required to donate a minimum of \$1,000 or 200 service hours to a Habitat for Humanity project in their community. Report activity using the online Program Report Form (#10784).

LEAVE NO NEIGHBOR BEHIND

Councils are required to do an activity in all five service activity categories. Report your activities with the Leave No Neighbor Behind Survey at www.kofc.org/neighbor. Please Note: Participating in the Food for Families program may be counted towards both categories (Family and Community), and should be reported for both. To ensure your council's refund, please also submit the Food for Families Refund and Plaque Application (#10057). To obtain one credit for Leave No Neighbor Behind, completion of one additional service activity is required, in addition to service activity 4. Feed the Hungry.





Catholic Citizenship Essay Contest

Details:

- To obtain maximum participation the contest MUST be Council driven
- Council representatives shall contact local schools to make them aware of the contest and invite their students' participation
- ➤ Contest is open to students in grades eight (8) through twelve (12)
- >Schools are asked to submit ONE winner for EACH grade level
- Councils will submit the BEST entry for each grade to the DISTRICT DEPUTY
- ➤ District Deputy (or team) will submit the district's winner to Ontario State
- >State Team will appraise and select FIRST and SECOND place in each grade
- >State Team will award prizes in each grade: first place \$200.00, second place \$100.00 and submit winner to Supreme for the international competition.
- ➤ Please be aware that, in addition to GKs and DDs, School Boards were notified directly two years ago therefore the staff should already be aware of the CCEC and the parameters.
- ➤ This year INCOMPLETE/LATE/NON-GUIDELINES entries WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED.

Catholic Citizenship Essay Contest

Topic:

- Essays must reflect the assigned theme available on the KofC website in Faith In Action section-Community programs: 2021-2022 Essay Topic. This year's topic is: "Describe everyday obstacles that you may have experienced or witnessed others experiencing while living a life of authentic faith. Explain how you have overcome these obstacles and how, by doing so, it has helped your faith to continue to grow."
- > Essays must be the student's original work
- Essays must be typed and limited to 500-750 words in length
- >The student's name will be typed and appear only on the CCEC Entry form and stapled to the essay.
- >All entries become the property of the KofC and will not be returned.

Timelines:

- The Essay Contest Council participation form (#4216) must be submitted to "Supreme Council Department of Fraternal Services by DEC 31.
- >September/October: Students write essays and submit school winners to councils.
- >October/November: Judges review essays for councils
- December: Essays submitted to District Deputy for District Judging where necessary and submitted to State for Jurisdiction judging and submission to Supreme for international entry. Due date for submission to State is December 18, 2021.

Roses for Life

- The first weekend in October (Oct 2-3, 2021) is Roses for Life Sunday. The Ontario Roses for Life program is easy to do and an effective way to raise money to support pro-life organizations and activities. All the council needs to do is order the Rose Lapels from the Ontario State Office and collect donations on the first weekend of October when distributing the Roses.
- Two years ago, the Ontario State Council redesigned the Rose Lapel. The new Rose has a red and a white Rose.
- The red rose signifies our opposition to abortion while the white rose is the symbol opposing euthanasia.
- The State council also designed a Roses for Life Cross with the red and white rose. The cross may be distributed in a similar way as the Rose Lapel or (based on its cost) it may be distributed to Knights of Columbus council members and their wives.
- Purchase the Roses for Life for \$45 for every 100 Roses + (\$10 shipping) from the State Office by using Form SO-15.
- Purchase the Roses for Life Cross Pin (20 or more) for \$2.50 each or (50 or more) for \$2.00 each + (\$10 shipping) from the State Office by using Form S0-15A.
