## The Role of a State Community Director Director

- ◆ Provides direction, coaching and support to his FIA state team, district deputies and council community directors
- → Promotes use of Supreme website, resources and trainings
- ★ Ensures that councils appoint adequate leadership for program roles
- ◆ Provides necessary accountability for program guidelines, established initiatives, goals and deadlines, including form submission
- Forms and fosters partnerships with external community organizations to ensure successful program development and expansion.





#### **COATS FOR KIDS**

Councils are required to distribute a total of 4 cases made up of any of the following coats types/styles. Report activity using the online Program Report Form (#10784). Type of Coat Coats in One Case:

- ♦ Girls Children Coats Sizes 4-6x fits Toddler to Grade 2
- ♦ Boys Children Coats Sizes 4-fits Toddler to Grade 2
- ♦ Girls Youth Coats Sizes 7-16 fits Grades 2 to Grade 7
- ♦ Boys Youth Coats Sizes 8-18 fits Grades 2 to Grade 7
- ♦ Girls TEEN Coats Sizes S-XL
- Boys TEEN Coats Sizes S-XL



#### **COATS FOR KIDS**

- ♦ 8292 new kids winter coats were distributed across Ontario in 2020
- ◆ Our goal for 2021: 10,000 coats
- ◆ Cost: \$335/box (includes taxes and S & H charges)
- ◆ Coats are available for delivery now. Not too late and the need is real
- Purchases or cash donations can be made online
- Credit card payments are accepted
- Individuals who purchase a box or make a cash donation (min. \$20) will be issued a charitable tax receipt.



### **GLOBAL WHEELCHAIR MISSION**

Councils are required to donate the equivalent of 10 wheelchairs at \$195 per chair to the Canadian Wheelchair Foundation, by raising funds through council, parish or community activities. Report activity using the online Program Report Form (#10784).

We would like to increase participation in this program by asking all Councils who can, to purchase two wheelchairs this fraternal year. The Knights in Canada partner with the Canadian Wheelchair foundation to buy our wheelchairs.





#### **GLOBAL WHEELCHAIR MISSION**

The program is a life changing project that provides freedom and mobility to people in need in your Parish, Community or in an international country. This is accomplished by:

- ★ Raising awareness of the needs and abilities of people with physical disabilities.
- Delivering mobility into the lives of children, teens and adults in the world who have no means to acquire a wheelchair.
- → Transforming lives through mobility, and with it giving to all those deprived of it by war, disease, accident, natural disaster and advanced age, their independence, dignity, hope and opportunity.

#### HABITAT FOR HUMANITY

- ◆ Councils are required to donate a minimum of \$1,000 or 200 service hours to a Habitat for Humanity project in their community. Report activity using the online Program Report Form (#10784).
- ◆ Opportunities to volunteer individually or as a group at locations province wide and internationally,
- Volunteering for Habit for Humanity is a great way to promote fraternalism and District and Council spirit.



#### LEAVE NO NEIGHBOR BEHIND

◆ Councils are required to do an activity in all five service activity categories. Participating in the Food for Families program may be counted towards both categories (Family and Community), and should be reported for both. To ensure your council's refund, please also submit the Food for Families Refund and Plaque Application (#10057). To obtain one credit for Leave No Neighbor Behind, completion of one additional service activity is required, in addition to service activity 4. Feed the Hungry.



#### LEAVE NO NEIGHBOR BEHIND

- ★ Five main service activity:
  - Support your Brother Knights: No council should leave a Brother Knight behind, fulfilling the vision of charity and unity upon which Father McGivney founded our Order.
  - Support your Parish: Councils must reinforce their pastor and show that Knights stand ready to support him and the parish community.
  - **Support your community**: Whatever the need, councils are encouraged to assess and creatively support their broader community.
  - Feed the hungry: Knights can donate to, and assist with, distribution at local food pantries and food banks so no one in their community goes to bed hungry at night.
  - Participate in blood drives: As the Red Cross issues emergency calls for donations, Knights can once again lead the charge to give the gift of life.

- ◆ Contest is open to students in grades eight (8) through twelve (12)
- Schools are asked to submit ONE winner for EACH grade level
- Councils will submit the BEST entry for each grade to the DISTRICT DEPUTY

#### Details:

- District Deputy (or team) will submit the district's winner to Ontario State
- ◆ State Team will appraise and select FIRST and SECOND place in each grade
- ◆ State Team will award prizes in each grade: first place \$200.00, second place \$100.00 and submit winner to Supreme for the international competition.

Explain how you have overcome these obstacles and how, by doing so, it has helped your faith to continue to grow."



### Catholic Citizenship Essay Contest

#### Timelines:

- ◆ The Essay Contest Council participation form (#4216) must be submitted to "Supreme Council Department of Fraternal Services by DEC 31.+
- ♦+September/October: Students write essays and submit school winners to councils.
- ♦ October/November: Judges review essays for councils
- December: Essays submitted to District Deputy for District Judging where necessary and submitted to State for Jurisdiction judging and submission to Supreme for international entry. Due date for submission to State is December 18, 2021.
