STATE DEPUTY'S MESSAGE

It gives me great pleasure to highlight the charitable activities that we have been involved in, on behalf of all Knights in Ontario, since the start of the fraternal year on July 1st. While our councils engage in numerous charitable activities, depending on the needs of their Church and community, at the provincial level we concentrate on those charitable activities that benefit the entire province.

Wheelchairs for Ukraine was launched at the Ontario State Convention last April. It usually takes a year to raise funds, order and distribute a container load of 170 wheelchairs; however, the response to this initiative was so good that we were able to raise the funds for 272 wheelchairs in three months. Our partners at the Canadian Wheelchair Foundation sourced the wheelchairs in Europe to avoid the usual shipping delays from China, and the extra cost of European made wheelchairs was absorbed by a generous donation from Supreme Council. The wheelchairs were delivered to our Brother Knights in Lviv, Ukraine in mid-September and Ukrainian State Deputy,

Youriy Maletskiy, along with Christiana Flessner, Executive Director of the Canadian Wheelchair Foundation, have been overseeing their distribution. Our members and donors in Ontario deserve much praise for their quick and generous response.

Coats for Kids is in full swing at the time of writing this article. So far, we have purchased over 6,400 coats and we were on track to reach our target of 10,000 coats when we ran into supply issues. We purchase coats through Supreme Council and they were not prepared for this year's demand and are running short of many sizes. We hope they are able to resolve the supply issues so that we can meet the demand for warm winter coats in Ontario.

Coats for Kids is the featured charity for our Fall 50/50 draw. We kicked off our Coats for Kids distribution at Princess Margaret Elementary School in Niagara Falls in early November by delivering nine boxes of coats. Princess Margaret was chosen because that school has a large number of children of Ukrainian refugees and they were in desperate need of warm coats for the coming winter. Again, much praise goes to our members and donors for their generosity.

Our 50/50 lottery has had different featured charities throughout the past year. Through the lottery we have supported food banks and homeless shelters across the province. Our summer raffle supported Ontario Special Olympics and our current raffle supports Coats for Kids. The raffle will undergo some changes next year that will hopefully improve the amount of funds we are able to raise.

Christmas is a season of charitable giving and our Councils and their members are busy addressing the needs of their Church and community with their usual generosity.

On behalf of my wife, Charlene, and daughter, Grace, I would like to wish all of our members in Ontario a happy and holy Christmas and all of the very best in the New Year! Vivat Jesus!

In addition to his role as parish priest and spiritual founder of the Knights of Columbus, Blessed Father Michael J. McGivney has embarked on a post-mortem journey toward sainthood since 1996. On March 15, 2008, Pope Benedict XVI declared him Venerable and, on October 31, 2020, the Venerable Michael McGivney was beatified.

Blessed Father McGivney's ability to intercede in our daily lives has been recognized at the only Honoris in Canada located at St. Patrick Basilica where a "Request for favours box" has been installed. This is a very private and confidential part of The Honoris, but it is made available to the faithful who may wish to send a request for favours. You may send a request by mail or via email which will then be printed and placed in the box.

In both cases, should you so desire, you may include a return email address for us to confirm that your request has been received and placed in the "Request for favours box" located at the Honoris. Every day, members of our Honoris Committee pray on behalf of all those requests received and placed in the "Request for favours box."

A fundraising initiative has also begun with an official launch date of July 1, 2023. This initiative consists of a seven-day candle which features a picture of Blessed Father McGivney with the prayer for his canonization on the other side. Each candle sells for \$20. Pre-orders are available now.

Every Columbian year, around this time, the State Advocate sends out the first notice for the upcoming election of state board officers scheduled for the 2023 Annual State Convention in Niagara Falls (April 28 – April 30, 2023).

Grand Knights have already received a letter to that effect, but I wanted to reach out to the membership because these elections should cause each member to realize his duty by taking an active part in this important affair.

As a minimum, the position of Warden will be vacant for the 2023-2024 Columbian year and will need to be filled. So, there will be at least one State Board election.

Members in good standing who may wish to submit their candidacy for election to the Ontario State Board should familiarize themselves with the "Standing Rules Governing Election of the State Board Officers for the Jurisdiction of Ontario." These rules were adopted by the members of the Ontario Knights of Columbus, in Annual State Convention, assembled in 2018.

Potential nominations must also be cognisant of the need to complete an "SO-09 Nomination Form for Election." It must be received by the state office between January 1, 2023, and April 1, 2023.

The choice of officers is in your hands. You should exercise your prerogative and be on hand for the nominations and elections.

Wheelchairs for Ukraine

In partnership with The Canadian Wheelchair Foundation,(CWF) the Ontario Knights of Columbus councils have been able to raise over \$75,000 and provide wheelchairs to

victims of the war in Ukraine.

The CWF told us that it took a little while to establish all contacts and procedures, but they were able to send the first two shipments totalling almost 400 wheelchairs (and some rollators) to Poland. The Knights from Poland and Ukraine jointly decided to leave 70 wheelchairs in Poland to help Ukrainian refugees.

The remaining wheelchairs are stored in a rural, safe area outside of Lviv, Ukraine where they were blessed by Archbishop Lori during his visit in October. The Ukraine Knights are slowly beginning to deliver them. Below are some photos. They will be brought in smaller amounts to Kyiv and other cities by the Knights, - as is safe! All wheelchairs were labelled with the KofC logo.

Due to huge uncertainties in timing and drastically increased cost to ship our regular wheelchairs from our factories in China, the CWF decided to source wheelchairs in Europe, then ship to the Knights of Columbus warehouse in Lancut, Poland, and from there to Lviv, Ukraine. Of course, the cost was higher than our regular \$195/wheelchair, averaging \$270/wheelchair. We are happy to announce that the CWF received funds from Supreme to make up the difference between our regular donation per wheelchair and the actual amount needed to deliver to Lancut, Poland. We would like to thank our Supreme Director, Arthur Peters for is hard work to make this happen! It allowed us to distribute these wheelchairs in Ukraine.

On behalf of the State Board, I would like to thank all the councils and individuals who participated in the Wheelchairs for Ukraine Campaign. You have made a big impact in the lives of so many victims. I personally would like to acknowledge the efforts of Christiana Flessner, Executive Director from the CWF. She was able to get the order done and delivered in a war zone in a record time. We appreciate her continued support and her commitment to this amazing program. Together we are making an impact around the world.

In the immediate term the CWF is arranging another project like this and then for the mid-term consider a new shipment from China after reviewing shipping cost. It will be good to see our Canadian red wheelchairs going out again!

Mother Teresa said that: "The most terrible poverty is loneliness, and the feeling of being unloved."

Seniors Program: We urge every council, through our Seniors program, to visit or call their members and members wives, who have lost their ability to attend Church based on age or disability. Many older members and those in our parish community, live lives of loneliness and need a visit or a phone call.

Widows Program: As we approach Christmas councils should be thinking about giving a Christmas card and a gift (such as a poinsettia) to our widows. This program offers significant community benefits but it requires organizing a list of widows, purchasing cards and gifts and then arranging to visit or deliver the cards and gifts. We remember those who have gone before us and we care for our widows.

Mother Teresa said that "Abortion has become the greatest destroyer of peace."

The Aid and Support After Pregnancy (ASAP) program is designed to increase assistance to mothers and children in need. Council's that donate \$500 or more (up to \$2000) to a qualifying pregnancy resource center or maternity home, the Supreme Council will top up your donation by donating 20% more. Your council must submit the ASAP program application to Supreme.

We recognize the benefit of donating to Pregnancy Resource Centers and Maternity homes that are providing an alternative to abortion, but now our support for these services go further. I encourage councils to participate in this program. Human life is always a precious gift. Let's make a difference.

March for Life

This year the March for Life is celebrating its 50 Anniversary and celebrating the end of the US Supreme Court 1973 abortion decision (Roe) that was overturned on June 24. If you're interested in attending the March for Life in Washington DC on Jan. 20, 2023, contact Brother Alex Schadenberg.

We need every council to support the National March for Life in Ottawa which will be on May 11, 2023. Whether a council sponsors a bus or helps a brother Knight and his family attend, we must put into action that the Knights of Columbus are pro-life.

Many councils in the Ottawa area have provided volunteers at the March for Life in Ottawa, ushers at the masses, distributing signs, March for Life marshal's and more, but the Knights of Columbus have proudly become a visible presence at every March for Life.

REVIEW YOUR FINANCIAL SITUATION BY USING OUR FINANCIAL NEEDS ANALYSIS SOFTWARE

By: General Agent, The Sangemino Agency, Sonny Sangemino CHS, FIC, CPCA Over my almost 26 years of working for the Order's insurance program I have had countless situations where members have benefitted immensely from participation in our member benefits programs. I wanted to share one such instance.

One day I was sitting with Bill and Nancy*, and we were reviewing their financial situation by using our financial needs analysis software. They were in relatively good health, in their mid to late 50s, but both were smokers. Bill was the main bread winner and Nancy worked part time. The family had a substantial mortgage and some line of credit debt. As we performed their needs analysis, one item they both agreed upon was their desire that if either passed away they wanted to ensure the surviving spouse would be debt free and would have tax free money on hand.

The issue was that tobacco use can severely impact the cost of coverage. The family already had some nice small Whole Life policies but desperately needed additional term coverage to meet this need. I showed them a Term policy on both. Bill was surprised by the premium and got visibly upset. He indicated the premium was too high and said he would apply on himself only and we could forget a policy on Nancy. Nancy agreed the premium was a bit high but was adamant that she thought it was important that she at least apply for the coverage. We discussed this for quite some time before Bill grudgingly agreed to apply for both policies.

Both policies were approved at healthy Tobacco rates. When I presented the final numbers both Bill and Nancy agreed that they would accept both policies on delivery, although Bill was not happy with the premium. 

1. Kelly: Supreme Knight Patrick E Kelly is the 14th Supreme Knight of the Knights of Columbus, having taken office on March 1, 2021.

4. Cosentino: Author Frank Cosentino wrote the book on the Flying Fathers Hockey Club. They began in 1964 in North Bay, Ontario. A group of priests from the North were brought together to play a team from local radio station CFCH to raise funds for local charities. It was a huge success, drew more than 3,000 fans, and was the talk of the community.

5. Fallon: Most Reverend Bishop Michael F. Fallon, a native of Kingston, Ontario. While he was the pastor for St. Joseph's Church in Ottawa (1898-1901), he was elected State Chaplain on the first State Council for Canada and Newfoundland on May 24, 1900. He later became the State Chaplain for Ontario between 1911-1927.

6. Phelan: The Longest serving State Deputy is Philip Phelan from Ottawa subordinate Council #485. He served from 1936 to 1942 for a total of 6 years.

7, Gorman: Michael James Gorman from Ottawa Council #485 had been elected State Deputy for Ontario for one term (1904-1905). On January 14, 1922, he was elected as the founding Faithful Navigator of the first Fourth Degree Assembly in Ontario: Cartier Assembly #860 in Ottawa.

8. Ontario: Ontario Council 755 in Cornwall holds the record of the members of any council in Ontario. A record that was officially acknowledges by State Deputy Raymond Braün in a letter dated September 16, 1993.

1.Kateri: Kateri Tekakwitha (baptized Catherine), known as the Lily of the Mohawks, first North American Aboriginal person elevated to sainthood (born in 1656 at Ossernenon in Iroquois country, now Auriesville, NY; died 17 April 1680 at the St. Francis Xavier Mission at Sault St. Louis, New France, (now Kahnawake). On 21 October 2012, Catherine was elevated to sainthood and became the first North American Aboriginal person to be canonised.

2. Hearn: Supreme Knight Edward L. Hearn was elected Supreme Knight in 1899 and served in that capacity for ten years until 1909.

3. Louis: French Canadian Prime Minister Louis S. St-Laurent, (November 15, 1948 to June 21, 1957), was a member of the Knights of Columbus. He is the only Canadian Prime Minister to have been a Knight.

4.Champlain: Council #1926 Champlain in Ottawa was the first French speaking subordinate council. It was chartered on August 22, 1918. Changing demographics led to it being dissolved later.
