


"Like Father, Like Son"

I am delighted to share with you the vibrant journey of our Order in Ontario over the past year, its current standing, and our exciting future prospects at our Annual State Convention.

This past fraternal year, I spent considerable time on the road for a listening tour, which I affectionately called the "Are We There Yet?' Tour". This was a profound journey of discovery and connection. At each council, I found wisdom and a deep sense of fellowship. These experiences didn't



just inform me; they transformed me, reinforcing my dedication to enhancing our Order and serving our community.



Reading Bishop Fulton Sheen's "The Holy Hour Prayer Book" has been a source of great inspiration for me. His words resonate deeply with our mission:

"A broken bone gives pain because it is not where it ought to be; our souls are in agony because we are not tending to the fullness of life, Truth, and Love, which is God."

These words perfectly encapsulate our theme for this year's Annual State Convention: "Like Father, Like Son."

As we reaffirm our roles as Catholic men, husbands, and fathers through our Order, Bishop Sheen's message of Love and Truth is exactly what I needed to hear, making it a perfect theme for this year's Annual State Convention: "Like Father, Like Son". In these challenging times, the theme of family, especially the role of fatherhood, is more relevant than ever. Our Order stands as a beacon of hope and strength for families, championing the sanctity and health of family life. This year, we have not only upheld but also significantly advanced this noble cause. It is my hope that the following paragraphs will inform you of the positive impact we, as Catholic men, husbands, and fathers, are having as members of the Knights of Columbus.

Year in Review

As the end of our fraternal year approaches and we begin preparations to celebrate our 125th anniversary, we should take stock of some of our major achievements this past year and review our strategy to reach, engage, and convert new members to the Order. With these thoughts in mind, and mindful that we are welcoming new contributors to this convention book, let us recall the following major milestones of the year.

As part of the worldwide Order, we mourned the loss of Pope Emeritus Benedict XVI, as well as our past State Deputy Paul Crawford. We rallied on the March for Life in both Washington DC and again in May in Ottawa. We have provided crucial relief in Ukraine and launched a new COR program, enhancing our connection to Christ. **COR**, meaning 'heart' in Latin, emphasizes three core elements: Prayer, Formation, and Fraternity, all guiding our hearts towards God and each other. Likewise, we saw the introduction of the Blessed Michael J. McGivney Leader Fellowship created to help State Deputies identify, train, and develop future leaders of the Order.

Closer to home, we had a big year, much of which was due to renewed interest from our members and leaders at all levels.

Québec + 1 Strategic Action Plan

Our plan was forged from listening, learning, and anticipating the needs of a changing demographic and a new culture of leadership. This plan is not just about change; it's about building trust and inspiration, about opening new doors with new keys to help those in need by communicating in a clear, concise, and effective manner, inspired by our talented base of volunteers.

We have witnessed incredible milestones this year. Notably, the Ontario government recognized our legacy of service. The Minister of Mental Health and Addictions, Hon Michael Tibolo, a brother Knight, honoured us for our commitment to community service.

Membership

We have seen a remarkable increase in our membership, now standing at approximately 55,000, and we are optimistic that we will reach 56,000 by the end of this Fraternal year. This membership growth is a testament to our Order's appeal and the relevance of our mission in today's world. Each new member brings fresh energy and perspective, helping us to surpass even our own benchmarks. As of December 31, 2023, we welcomed 918 new members, marking a significant increase from the 739 members recorded on December 31, 2022. This represents a nearly 25% increase in just one year.

Furthermore, our conversion rate — the rate at which we successfully convert our **eMembers** into Council members — has impressively doubled, achieving a 100% increase compared to the previous year. This is due, in no small part, to the efforts of our Online Membership Chairman, Dem Magmanlac. In a similar vein, we have gone from one of the highest rejections rate of online members a few years ago to one of the lowest rates now at 10%. In essence, we are surpassing our past performance and effectively outpacing our biggest competitor - our achievements from the previous year.

New Councils and Round two Tables are these also indicative of a healthy jurisdiction. In Ontario, for example, we established two of the three new Councils in the country so far this fraternal year. With deep appreciation for our Round Table Chairman, Dan Pergolesi, we have also exceeded our objective during this same time period with 32 new Round Tables.

Coats for Kids

Our 'Coats for Kids' initiative has been a heartwarming success story. Anyone not impacted by this initiative and by the smiles it brings to children and homeless veterans needs to check their heart for a pulse. This year, we surpassed all previous records and our goal of 10,000, delivering more than 11,000 coats and reaching a cumulative total of over 100,000 since the program's inception in 2008. Each coat symbolises hope and the tangible impact of our collective efforts. Our efforts represent approximately 10% of the entire number of coats donated throughout the Order.

Veterans' House Canada

Under this Administration, we have reached out to the veteran community. Specifically, we have committed to erecting a cenotaph at the shelter for homeless veterans in Ottawa. We have introduced battle bead rosaries for our members and our serving Canadian servicemen and women. Finally, we have also donated winter coats to those in need. These initiatives, although centred in Ottawa for the time being, are expected to expand across the province and the country. Once again, Ontario can take pride in being the lead on this issue, much like we were with the Canadian Catholic Army Huts program during the Great War (1914-18) and during the Second World War (1939-45).

The spiritual heritage of Blessed Father Michael J. McGivney is his precious gift to the Knights of Columbus. We owe it to him and to our church to share his gift with those we meet and with whom we work, and I have been heartened and fortified by our team effort. Similarly, we marked the 2023-2024 year by adopting Saint Kateri Tekakwitha as our patroness, which included a pilgrimage to the Francis-Xavier Mission Church in Kahnawake, Québec, a prayer card we use at our events, and a prayer candle that is available for sale from our state office store. Our brother Knights in Kahnawake, Quebec, agreed to loan one of only two St Kateri statues from the Shrine for our State Council events between 2023-2025.

Finances

Included in this convention book is a report from our State Treasurer, Joe Bodnar, but I did want to acknowledge the exceptional support we are receiving from our subordinate councils regarding their annual per capita fees. For example, on July 1, 2023, the new State Board Inherited assessed subordinate Council per capita arrears in the amount of \$210,000. By February 2024, this amount had been reduced by 90% to approximately \$21,000. This support has made our State Council budgeting easier and restored considerable stability to our financial statements and projections.

Social Media

Thus far, in this fraternal year, our Facebook page ("Knights of Columbus Ontario State Council") has gone from 2.1K followers to more than 5K followers. Visits to our FB page have increased by 160%. Currently, we have 1,617 followers on "X" (formerly Twitter) with more than 10K Impressions. Likewise, on Instagram, we have 452 followers, and the number of visits has increased by 124%.

Conclusion



It is my pleasure to serve as your State Secretary as we begin preparations to celebrate our 125th anniversary in the next Fraternal Year. Below is a brief update on the portfolios that I am managing. Highlights from the past year include:

Diocesan Associations

As many of you are aware, this Administration initiated an ambitious restructuring plan which resulted in a reduction of subordinate councils and districts. This restructuring, in turn, led to a 40% turnover of District Deputies. The positive outcome of this reconfiguration is that, for the first time in collective memory, all councils now have an assigned District Deputy.

Following this, there was a need to revisit the structure of the Diocesan Associations. This year, I am pleased to report that all Diocesan Associations have been assigned or have elected a chairman and are now able to resume their critical role in mentoring, training, and informing executive council officers about local, regional, and provincial issues, and in electing delegates for the upcoming Supreme Convention in Québec City in 2024. In other words, these DA officers embody our theme of "Like Father, Like Son."

To put this effort into perspective, on July 1, 2023, there were nine DAs without chairmen or executives, in some cases for as long as six years. To address this issue, our State Deputy embarked on his "Are we there yet?" tour, visiting those Northern DAs experiencing difficulties, while I reached out via telephone, email, and in some instances, Bruce Poulin visited in person. I am pleased to report that this two-pronged approach achieved the desired results.

Specifically, we now have 17 Diocesan Associations, each with at least a chairman, and in most cases, a full executive team.

Meetings

Whether it is a State Board meeting, a State Convention, or District Deputy workshops, my role is to keep a true and faithful record of these meetings. Although these minutes will, in time, form the official legacy of the Order in Ontario, I must say I most enjoy being the master of ceremonies.

Fourth Degree

Considering that the Fourth Degree will also be celebrating its 125th anniversary in 2025, our State Deputy has asked me to act as the State Board liaison with our Vice Supreme Master, Joe Mathews, and explore opportunities for cooperation and celebration in the next Fraternal Year.

To summarize, we are fortunate to build upon the solid foundation created during an extremely successful 2023-2024 Fraternal Year, which allows us to bring our message of hope to many more in need. Finally, I am filled with optimism for the next year as we launch into an exciting time, celebrating the 125th anniversary of the Order in Ontario. This would not be possible without the help and suggestions of our brother Knights, for which I am eternally grateful.

Joseph Bodnar State Treasurer



It is a pleasure to serve as your State Treasurer, and I am grateful for the cooperation I have received from the council financial secretaries this past Fraternal Year. In this capacity, I am responsible for managing all State council funds, which includes receiving, recording, safeguarding, and disbursing funds via the general, office, charity, and trust accounts. Responsibilities include, but are not limited to, collecting and disbursing funds, setting a yearly budget, and keeping your yearly per capita collection up to date. Below is my report on the responsibilities to which I have been assigned.



Per Capita Charges and Collection

In the first week of January, each active council is sent their yearly State per capita charges for all active members according to the council membership list we receive from Supreme on January 1st. Our increases, usually based on the annual cost of living index, consider our planned yearly budget to operate a State Council the size of Ontario. This year, through our collective efforts, we reduced our per capita arrears from \$210,000 to just under \$21,000 – a reduction of almost 90%. By cooperating in the collection of the per capita fees, which represents almost 60% of our total revenue stream, we maintain financial stability and secure our budgeting process. Our yearly audited financial records are available for your review in this year's Convention book. Additionally, we will have a financial audit presentation by our State Auditor this weekend, where you will be able to ask any questions regarding our financial status.

50/50 Raffle

This Fraternal Year, the State Board officers decided to use Rafflebox <u>rafflebox.ca</u> to host our bi-annual **50/50 raffle**. This decision was based on their fee structure and the fact that they are a Canadian company. Our first raffle for 2024 began on January 1st with an Early Bird draw on February 14, 2024, and the final draw will take place this weekend (Sunday, April 28th). Please purchase your tickets in the marketplace to support our local charities.

The next raffle will begin on September 1st and will run until December 31, 2024. Our goal as a State Board is to return 25% of your council's gross sales back to be deposited into your charity account for use in supporting your local charities. We now offer each council the use of a P.O.S. (Point of Sale) machine that you can request from our State Office for a two-week period for your fundraisers or council events. These machines will be mailed to your council along with rolls of paper to print the purchased tickets. There is no charge to your council for borrowing these machines, and you will likely see an increase in your council's sales.

State Bursary

Each year, the State Council offers five student bursaries of \$1,000 each to first-year fulltime students attending an accredited college or university in Ontario. The deadline is June 1st, so there is still time to apply. Applications are available on the State website under the community/bursary link.

125th Anniversary Sponsorship

Earlier this year, each District Deputy was presented with a sponsorship package to be presented to each council to support the costs of running the 125th Anniversary celebrations across the province for the next Fraternal Year. To create a historical record of all active councils in the province, we are asking each district to share the cost of an advertising package in the 2025 State Convention book, where you can highlight your council's name, number, location, and executive members.

"Movember" 2023

This year, the Ontario State Board once again participated in the Movember challenge to raise funds for men's health care research. The State Board team raised \$10,000 in donations, and with the help of other councils participating, the total donations from the Knights of Columbus in Ontario was \$24,960. Our organization is now one of the largest contributors to this cause in Ontario. We encourage the men in your council to participate in next year's event to help raise much-needed funds for this research.

Squires

Having been an active Squire counselor in my local circle (S.K. Leonard T. Smith Circle 4742, Oshawa) for the past 22 years, I was excited to be asked once again to be the State Squire Liaison officer for the State Board. Reflecting on this year's theme: "Like Father, Like Son," I watch and work with these young men on the Columbian Squire Ontario Provincial Board and look forward to the day when many of these same young men will take up leadership positions within their own councils and more.

Your \$40.00 yearly Squire assessment fee (payable from your charity account) helps cover the costs of running the Provincial Board: meals, transportation, annual workshops, attending the District Deputy meetings, State Convention, and their Squires Provincial convention. Please support them in their raffle they are holding this weekend, which helps offset their convention attendance costs.

Tricia and I would like to congratulate and thank State Squire Director Enzo Caterina, his wife Karen, and their team of chairpersons for providing the Provincial Board members from across the province with the opportunity to serve and represent the other Circles. I would also like to thank the other State Board members for their continued support; it has been a pleasure working with them to serve you as a united board. We all look forward to serving you and preparing to celebrate our 125th Anniversary next year!

Henry Miller State Advocate



As State Advocate, it is my responsibility and privilege to support you in understanding and effectively using what can best be thought of as essential tools, as elaborated below, that safeguard the integrity and good reputation of our Order. Under this mentorship approach, I have been mindful of your councils' willingness to operate in and serve your parishes and local communities as effectively as possible. In this mentorship role, I have listed below some updates on the portfolios I am managing.



Liability Insurance

In an era of increased litigation, all measures that will make it easier for members to volunteer for programs and seek election to a Council's executive, requires sound liability insurance coverage. Councils may obtain liability insurance through brokers of their choice. In doing so, however, they must ensure they have proper and adequate coverage.

Most Ontario councils obtain their liability insurance through Jones DesLauriers. More specifically, David Gottlieb (a brother Knight) works with individual councils to determine the specific coverage and pricing that is best suited to them. To date, more than 350 councils have purchased liability insurance with Jones Deslauriers for this fraternal year, approximately 63% of Ontario councils.

Liability Insurance includes two important facets. They are the Knights of Columbus Safe Environment Program and the Jones Deslauriers Risk Management Protocol and Abuse, Discrimination, Harassment Prevention Policy.

Safe Environment Program

This year, Triton Canada, a Canada-based company, has been hired so that all personal information related to background verifications remains in Canada. This program remains a key component of any Star Council Award and needs to be prioritized accordingly.

Risk Management Protocol and Abuse, Discrimination, Harassment Prevention Policy (the "P&P")

Consistent with the requirements of the Safe Environment Program, Ontario's P&P addresses the unique needs of Ontario's councils. It sets out the requirements for background checks for council members participating in programs involving youth, in addition to the background checks required for specific positions under the Safe Environment Program. It is mandatory that council members annually attest to their familiarity with the requirements of the P&P. Supported by David Gottlieb, Account Executive with our Ontario State liability insurance broker, Jones DesLauriers, we have been striving to ensure that complying with P&P requirements is as straightforward as possible. Two well-received innovations supporting this are the P&P slideshow and the one-page 'traffic light' guide to additional background check needs.

Council Database Repository

The repository was designed and created through councils' consideration of a resolution concerning essential document retention at the 2022 Ontario State Convention, an excellent example of positive State and council collaboration.

Resolutions

Safeguarding both solidarity and subsidiarity, resolutions are our means of ensuring that we best meet the evolving needs of our order and our councils and their parishes and communities. When, at our convention, we discuss and adopt resolutions, we have a powerful and practical way to inform and influence our order, e.g. through recommendations that, in turn, may be adopted through resolutions considered at the Supreme convention. We also have a powerful and practical means of influencing various other elements of society, through being attuned to both the local and broader societal concerns that inform the resolution crafting process.

Mindful of the solidarity of our core principles of charity, unity, fraternity and patriotism, it has been my great pleasure, over the past year, to assist councils and individual Knights in understanding and effectively using the various essential tools of good governance and sound risk management at their disposal, as elaborated above. In so doing, I have met and spoken with many individuals. In the spirit of this year's theme "Like Father, Like Son," I shall always savour the joy of mentoring and making new acquaintance and, in many cases, earning that true friendship which is rooted in objectivity, fairness and mutual respect.







I am pleased to be serving on the Ontario State Board as the Immediate Past State Deputy, as well as holding the positions of Director of Evangelization and Faith Formation and Director of New Council Development. In addition to these directorships, I have also been responsible for updating the Leaderboard on the Ontario State website daily.



Evangelization and Faith Formation

Evangelization and Faith Formation is a new directorship established by the Supreme Council with the goal of implementing the Supreme Knight's new Cor initiative. Many men, especially young men, join the Knights of Columbus because they feel isolated in their faith by secular society and seek to share their faith in a social setting with like-minded Catholic men.

Evangelization and Faith Formation is a new directorship instituted by the Supreme Council for the purpose of Implementing the Supreme Knight's new **Cor** initiative. Many men, and especially young men, join the Knights of Columbus because they feel isolated in their faith by secular society and want to be able to share their faith, in a social setting, with like minded Catholic men.

Cor addresses this need through men's faith formation meetings that include prayer and

fraternity. The name Cor, Latin for "Heart," derives from St. John Henry Newman's episcopal motto "Cor ad Cor Loquitur," which translates to "Heart Speaks to Heart". Cor meetings are comprised of three elements: prayer, formation, and fraternity, and are held separately from regular Council meetings. These meetings are conducted at least monthly and should be open to all men of the parish. Detailed information about Cor can be found on the Supreme website: www.kofc.org/cor.

I attended three days of **Cor** training in New Haven, CT, last August along with Faith Director Joseph Remedios. **Cor** was initiated in Ontario last September, and nearly 30 councils have successfully implemented the program to date with excellent results. I have been attending District and Diocesan Association meetings across the province to promote Cor and have discussed it with several Bishops, receiving their enthusiastic support.

New Council Development

Last Fraternal Year, we formed three new councils in Ontario. As of the writing of this report, we have established two new councils so far this Fraternal Year: St. Gaspar del Bufalo Council 18394 in Toronto and Sacred Heart Council 18397 in Paris. Our goal is to form four new councils, and there are several prospects in the pipeline: six are actively recruiting and another eight are under consideration. Starting a new council requires twenty members, who can be either new members or transfers. Primarily, the responsibility of forming a new council falls to the District Deputy, and I have been promoting New Council Development at the District Deputy meetings.







The Québec+1 Strategic Action Plan we adopted under State Deputy Bruce S. Poulin was both ambitious and Innovative. There were many parts, but our focus, under membership, was twofold. First, our State Deputy and his Membership Team would reach out to our subordinate Councils and their members who were still recovering from the COVID-19 lockdowns and inspire them to get moving again. Second, we looked at the data for the past 11 years and determined the monthly average. From here, we set our own monthly goals that were more realistic and achievable because



they were based on 11 years of data. From here, we could rank each month by average intake and manage expectations and effort.

There are twelve Membership Information Officers, so it was easy for our State Deputy to assign one month to each MIO. The purpose was to bring the resources and leadership of the State Board officers and directors to a specific MIO for a specific month. Using the "Like Father, Like Son" approach, they mentored and trained council executive officers during that specific month. The results were as expected: the month our State Deputy and his team visited the assigned MIO saw a corresponding uptake in recruitment. By February, this strategy not only saw our team achieve our membership goals, but we also began exceeding them. We are, to quote our State Deputy, who is a retired Artillery Officer, "On time and on target."

Conversion of Our Online Members



While registering online is a relatively new phenomenon with the Knights of Columbus, begun in 2018, it has become the largest component of our new members. Averaging 75% of all new members, the Québec+1 Strategic Action Plan needed to address this reality and seek out new ways to convert online members into regular members in subordinate councils. It was here that our new online membership chairman, Dem Magmanlac, has played a key role. So far, this fraternal year, he has, almost single-handedly, doubled the conversion rate from roughly 26% on June 30, 2023, to 53% by February 2024.

As we come to close our Fraternal Year, it is my Honour to report to the delegates gathered at the State Convention of 2023-2024 that the Faith pillar has performed extremely well in all its programs under the theme "Like Father, Like Son." This pillar encompasses some of the key programs that are the reason many of us joined the Order.



I have learned a lot from my role as Faith Director, and I understand even more why this is such a great Order. This pillar comprises several portfolios. Since I am afforded only limited space in this convention book, I will cover only the major ones.

Pilgrimage to St. Kateri Tekakwitha

Beginning in 2017, the State Council established a custom whereby a saint would be adopted as our patron. Effective July 1, 2023, under the Poulin Administration, the Patroness Saint Kateri Tekakwitha was adopted in the spirit of our Truth and Reconciliation efforts.

St. Kateri is the first Native American to be recognized as a saint by the Catholic Church. She was canonized by Pope Benedict XVI on October 21, 2012.

On July 23, 2023, following the District Deputy Workshop weekend, a pilgrimage was arranged for members to visit the St. Kateri

Shrine in Kahnawake, Québec. This visit included a traditional lunch and a special Mass with the local indigenous choir. The local Knights, who are partly responsible for the Shrine of St. Kateri, also agreed to loan our State Council one of the two statues of St. Kateri used at the Shrine for us to venerate for the duration of our current State Deputy's term.

Holy Hour

A Holy Hour was scheduled at both District Deputy Workshops held in July and December 2023, respectively. We were Honoured to have our Worthy State Chaplain be part of this wonderful prayer service, which concluded with Benediction. The service was followed by the celebration of Holy Mass.

We need to foster the need to spend more time with our Lord in the Blessed Sacrament, as it helps us to strengthen our confidence in our faith, especially during these difficult times.

Rosary Program

This year, our State Council continued the virtual Second Saturday Rosary Devotion program at 8:00 AM. We need to be unified by praying together so that, with our show of solidarity with Our Lady, we can continue to strengthen our faith to overcome all our tribulations and trials.

The relationship between the Ontario Knights of Columbus and the Rosary took on a new dimension during the Great War (1914-1918) when almost 20,000 rosaries were donated to our soldiers deployed overseas. This custom was repeated during the Second World War (1939-1945).

Our State Deputy, also a military veteran, wanted to remind our members of this proud legacy of support to our military community. To that end, each District Deputy, upon their installation, received a replica rosary from the Great War made of gunmetal. Since then, the program has grown exponentially with orders from our members, both retired and serving military members.

This year, the Feast was celebrated at St. John of the Cross Church in Mississauga and was very

It is a pleasure for me to present to you some of the highlights of the Family pillar of our Faith in Action programs for this Fraternal Year. As Catholic Knights of Columbus, we support the concept of lifelong matrimony between one man and one woman and parental responsibilities/rights because we are strong believers in the family – the bedrock of trust – which brings out the best in us all and makes our world go round. This approach is particularly relevant to our theme of "Like Father, Like Son."



While there is discussion about the concept of traditional versus modern families, we need to look no further than the Holy Family to draw inspiration and clarification of the roles of father, mother, and children. In fact, one of the Family Programs is the "Consecration to the Holy Family."

The Family Pillar consists of eight (8) programs that are executed at different times during the year. During 2023-24, we have seen an increase in the participation of Councils in various programs. This increase in participation is the result of a team effort (with Chairmen, District Deputies, State Office) and a concerted effort in communications (including Webinar, numerous articles, and presentations at District Deputy meetings). The Family of the Month / Family of the Year program remains underutilised. It is a simple way of recognising families for their good work contributing to Church, School, and Community. We hope to see this growing in the next Fraternal Year.

Not long ago, we celebrated Christmas. The "Keep Christ in Christmas" program saw good participation in the school poster contest, with 42 submissions. We also had several submissions of crèches/nativity scenes. The lawn signs, buttons, and magnets continue to be popular and provide fundraising opportunities for Councils.

In the spirit of giving, and to help alleviate the food insecurity issue, Councils had raised more than \$16,000 and 20,000 pounds of non-perishable foodstuffs. Although these amounts are impressive, we know government programs are falling short, and more needs to be done.

It has been an honour and privilege to serve as your Life Director this past Fraternal Year under the Poulin Administration. As the Life Director, my responsibilities include promoting our pro-life and anti-euthanasia portfolios, the purchase and donation of ultrasound machines, managing the Seniors' program, organizing blood donor clinics, and coordinating our involvement in the Special Olympics and the annual March for Life. It also includes overseeing our initiatives for the Special Olympics and the Christian Refugee Relief in the Holy Land and for Persecuted Christians,



which have their own separate reports in this book. Here is my report on the responsibilities assigned to me.

Pro-Life

As Catholic Knights of Columbus, we assume a leadership role in supporting the dignity of life from conception to natural death, consistent with our theme "Like Father, Like Son." We believe that all human beings, including the unborn, the vulnerable, the elderly, the broken, and the forgotten, are created in the image of God and are therefore wanted and loved. Ultrasound Machine

Building on our success in 2019, when we provided an ultrasound machine to a clinic in Ottawa, we are working to have another ultrasound machine donated to a clinic in the Toronto area before the end of this Fraternal Year.

Wheelshairs cost approximately \$200each, so this shipment to Puerto Rico represents a donation of \$22,000.

Prostate Cancer Awareness

Brother David Fisher was the Chairman of Movember with was another success story for the Ontario State Council. With thirty men participating, we raised over \$24,000.

Basketball Free Throw

This is another great initiative from the Knights of Columbus to Include the children. Thank you to Chairman of the Basketball Free Throw, Kevin Belanger for taking the reins and organizing all the Councils. A special mention to the Sault Ste Marie Diocesan Association for hosting a Regional Basketball Free Throw first the first in many years. They had more than 60 shooters in the gymnasium with just as many parents encouraging the shooters.



The Community Pillar, which forms an integral part of our Faith in Action initiative, is specifically designed to strengthen our communities, help our youth, show our Faith and of course Promote the Knights of Columbus. As your Community Director, I am grateful for the cooperation you have given me, and I invite you to keep up the great work.

Coats for Kids

Echoeing part of the State Deputy's report, we finally met and surpassed our target of donating 10,000 coats. Thanks to a special request from a First Nation Community in the Thunder Bay area for more than 1,000 coats, we not only met or as yet unfulfilled annual target of 10,000 coats but exceeded it by more than 1,500 coats in this Fraternal Year. The current cost of \$345 (icluding S&H) for a box of 12 brand new coats (or \$28 per coat). With the cost of living that keeps rising, more and more children will need our help to stay warm and go to school.



Blessed Father McGivney's ability to intercede in our daily lives has been recognized at the only Honoris in Canada located at the Spiritual home of the Knights of Columbus in Ontario at St. Patrick Basilica. Here, a "Request for favours box" has been installed. This is a very private and confidential part of The Honoris, but it is made available to

the faithful who may wish to send a request for favours. You may send a request by mail or via email which will then be printed and placed in the box.



The Honoris, which was established in 2013 and includes a first class relic of Father McGivney, is co-located with the pioneer Council of the Knights of Columbus in Ontario, St Patrick Basilica Ottawa Council 485, as well as the first Fourth degree Assembly in Ontario, Cartier Assembly 860.

On July 1, 2023, a new fundraising initiative was launched whereby seven-day candles, which features a picture of Blessed Father McGivney along with the prayer for his canonization on the other side, are available for purchase.



Christian Refugee Relief Holy Land and Persecuted Christians



In the last fraternal year, the Knights of Columbus in Ontario raised over \$780,000 for Christian Refugee Relief, a testament to the innovative restructuring under the Life pillar, including the creation of a new directorate.




Initiatives and Digital Outreach

Aligning with our "Like Father, Like Son" theme, Hikmat Dandan's efforts underscore the familial transmission of faith and service. The relief

program's revamp into over 15 initiatives has broadened participation across councils and communities. Following the launch of christianrefugeerelief.org. Deputy Supreme Knight Arthur Peters and Toronto's parishioners provided significant support. Key initiatives include aiding Catholic education within the Melkite Catholic Patriarchate and the successful jerusalemstudents.org project, alongside substantial donations: \$20,000 (CA) to the Melkite Catholic Patriarchal Seminary of St. Anne, \$100,000 (CA) for the Rosary Sisters Hospital's post-Beirut blast recovery, and a \$50,000 (US) contribution to Foyer de L'Amitié in Lebanon.

Compassionate Care for Orphans

The program has placed significant emphasis on caring for orphans. Alongside the \$5,000 (CA) donation to the Caritas Knights of Columbus orphanage in Poland to assist Ukrainian orphans, Hikmat has transferred \$5,000 (CA) each to The Holy Family Children's Home, known as Bethlehem Creche, in the Holy Land, and to Centre Saint Charbel Orphanage in Baabdath, Lebanon, These donations form part of his Orphans for Jesus initiative, supporting various orphanages from Poland to the Holy Land. Furthermore, \$77,300 (CA) was allocated to Foyer De La Providence, a Mosaic School for Challenged Youth in South Lebanon, a crucial contribution that helped keep the school operational.



In the midst of the Middle East's ongoing turmoil, the remarkable efforts of the Knights of Columbus have created a ripple of hope and support. The Christian Refugee Relief program's substantial donation of approximately \$250,000 (CA) to Caritas Lebanon, providing crucial aid such as food kits and medicines, particularly for the elderly, is a testament to the Knights' profound impact.



This narrative of resilience and compassion amid adversity is a clarion call to all councils, members, and their families across the globe. It urges us to tap into our collective potential to bring light and hope to those in despair. Each contribution for initiaives like ORPHANS FOR JESUS significantly uplifts those in dire need, supporting orphans and fulfilling the will of our Lord and the wish of Blessed Michael McGivney. Let us unite in our mission to brighten lives and demonstrate the strength of our commitment in the face of the evolving challenges faced by Christian refugees in the Middle East. Together, we can continue to forge paths of hope and solidarity in regions overshadowed by strife.




Joseph Mathews Vice Supreme Master




