I look forward serving the Order in this responsibility to interpret and uphold the rules and laws of our constitution.

I thank my proposers and all the delegates from our past three State conventions for your vote of confidence to serve as a State Board officer. I also thank all the District Deputies for their support and assistance as we have worked together to get councils compliant with the Safe Environment policy.

Brother Knights:

Having recently completed our annual Ontario State Convention, I would like to congratulate Brother David Peters on his election as State Deputy, and the members of the Ontario State Board who were elected for the 2019-2020 fraternal year. We look forward to their leadership and stewardship of the Order in Ontario over the next year.

I would also like to congratulate and thank State Deputy Dan Heffernan and his wife Rita for their leadership of the Order over the past two years. Dan and Rita have dedicated themselves to the betterment of Ontario during his terms as State Deputy, and we are grateful for all that they have done for the Knights of Columbus during this time.

As we enter the final few weeks of the fraternal year, State Deputy Heffernan has noted that we are 469 members away from achieving our intake quota for the fraternal year. This is less than one member per Council and should be achievable over the next six weeks.

Make a commitment to recruit at least one new members into the Order between now and June 30, and we will achieve Circle of Honor status as a jurisdiction – Councils achieving their membership quota will also receive a reduced per capita assessment from State, as well as the potential to have their Supreme per capita reduced if they achieve Star Council status.

You Council gets notified and Supreme contacts the interested prospect with occasional "soft sell Information" like Columbia articles, featured Faith in Action programs and relevant local content. The link is permanent and you can continue to use it as long as you wish. For those of us trained as Ontario State Regional Trainers, we also have a landing page setup for the Province at: http://bit.ly/ontariokofc

This link is very helpful for assisting Councils that don't feel they can follow up in a timely manner. We can help

them by entering our list of names and for the City, enter your Council number. This will let Ontario State know where the prospect was contacted and you will get help following up.

E membership in Ontario has been going very well. To date we have over 250 new brother knights through the program. This is great news as we are protecting more of our catholic brothers and families as Father McGivney envisioned.

Approximately 70% of these brothers have said they are interested in joining a local council. That being said, we are falling short on actually converting these brothers into degree members. Our conversion rate currently sits at 12%. We need to get these men into councils.

Brothers again I'm asking you to keep an eye on your "prospect" tab.

In Member Management each Grand Knight and Financial Secretary has a prospect tab. Within this tab you will find the names of the E member associated with your council.

This information is used similar to a church drive. When you have a prospect reach out to them, take them out for a coffee, talk to them about joining your council. These men have already shown interest in joining – meet and greet them – welcome them to your Council and find out their interests so you can engage them in a Program. As you know, this is the best way to keep members.

Brothers, **this is also an excellent recruitment tool.** If you have managed to recruit new members but a degree is too far down the road, USE eMembership.

It allows them to be part of the council until such time they can take their degree. If at a church drive you find some men who are not ready to commit to joining your council, offer them the online membership. Again, these men become your prospects and future council members.

Need more volunteers at your events?

Reach out to your prospects. This will give them a feel for what your council does and help nudge them closer to joining your council. Send them dates of your events and invite them to come out. They don't have to volunteer-perhaps just participating in the event is more in the comfort zone.

July 1, 2019 my tenure as eMembership Director ends. Thank you all for the efforts you have put into this program.

I pray you will continue to push this program and work with the new Director.

Online and social media is what appeals to many men these days, so we must utilize all avenues.

Today it seems that many men are not quick to join groups but are very comfortable online. Use this to our advantage to recruit members.

This year with a narrowed down scope including the Ottawa Race Weekend, is still adding up to better than last year with our target at \$7,000.



Brothers,

The Knights of Columbus programs typify the principles of the Order, bringing brother Knights together and reminding us of why we joined the Order in the first place. One program has made a resurgence recently, the Coats for Kids program. In Ontario, in 2016 we distributed 2676 new winter coats to children in need.

2017: A new approach

In 2017, we tried something different. We centralized the ordering process, with the Ontario State Board, councils and the field force all working together. As a result, that year we doubled our numbers and distributed 5256.

2018: A new vendor and increased participation

In 2018, we used a new Canadian vendor that offered a better-quality coat. We also saw more councils participate, which increased our coat count to 6859. As you can see, the trend is upwards. But what about this year? How many can we distribute in 2019?

2019: 10,000

We are ambitious and hopeful. We've set 10,000 new winter coats as our target. We think that it's attainable but to achieve this, two things need to happen. First, the councils that participated in the past will need to do so again this year, and second, we will need more councils participating. How many more? About 50% more.

50% INCREASE...

Last year, 120 councils (of approx. 535) participated in the Coats for Kids program across Ontario. Therefore, to achieve our goal of 10,000, an additional 50%, or 60 councils will need to buy into the program this year if we are to hit our goal.

The need for kids' winter coats remains a problem in Ontario.

Our Knights of Columbus are once again stepping up in a big way in Ontario when the country finds itself in a state of crisis. We have a long tradition of such service when our country faced the possibility of disaster during the great wars with the institution of the Knights of Columbus Catholic Army Huts. We provided food and entertainment, comfort and safety and everyone was welcome, everything free. We provided help and sustenance to the local people recently liberated by our troops overseas. This time around, we are not facing devastation from the ravages of a human war, we are being confronted by devastation brought on by nature itself.

Our Knights of Columbus, Ontario State Council has reached out to the NGO (Non-Government Organization) Alliance to offer our support in helping to alleviate the hardship that flooding has caused our local communities. They have responded by accepting whatever help we can provide. We recognize the need to coordinate our efforts so we don't duplicate them or get in the way of front-line responders. We can contribute directly on the ground by providing much needed supplies or limited hands-on support, or supplying or preparing breakfasts, lunches or dinners during the clean-up efforts.

The immediate crisis continues in some areas and is subsiding in others however, this may yet be a good time for us to step up, as the supplies may be running low and the crisis volunteers are going home for much-needed rest. We are hoping that we can establish action plans in each affected community to help fulfill the needs with the necessary supplies and logistics to meet such needs.

A CALL TO ACTION: Grand Knights, please reach out to all your members and ask them to come forward if they can volunteer in any capacity to help alleviate the hardship that the flooding in Ontario has caused – get

names and phone numbers so they can be easily reached when the time comes. Members, please reach out to your Grand Knights to volunteer. Grand Knights and District Deputies remember your district or council does not have to be in the flood stricken areas to be a part of the solution. Grand Knights and District Deputies, please assess if you can, your local conditions and make contact locally with the Emergency Operations and to see how you can help them during the crisis period, then coordinate your local volunteers with them. Councils who are not in the affected areas - please consider putting on a fundraising event to help us cover the costs of provisions for those affected residents and send in to the Ontario Knights of Columbus Charity Foundation, earmarking your funds for disaster relief. Please email Harold Marcotte at DD1@ontariokofc.ca to keep us abreast of your location, a brief flood relief activities and results, volunteer numbers and volunteer hours. In the meantime we will be formulating a plan for the future, where we will be better prepared to engage our members and community earlier in the events to come.

Thank you to the many Knights of Columbus members and families who attended and helped with the **National March for Life** in Ottawa. We were very pleased by the number of brothers who assisted as Marshalls, distributing March for Life signs, serving as ushers at the masses and attending the All Night Adoration. Many councils sponsored buses for the National March for Life bringing people to Ottawa from around Ontario.

This year we worked closely with the Pro-Life Initiates team at Supreme who helped us organize volunteers and to become a visible presence at the March for Life.

For instance, we had 40 Marshalls who did an excellent job at keeping the March orderly.

For many years the Ontario State Council has been unable to provide **ultrasound machines** for Crisis Pregnancy Centres (CPC) or Pro-Life physicians who work with CPC's due to Ontario medical regulations.

Research indicates that a mother who sees the ultrasound image of her baby will rarely have an abortion because the mother sees the humanity of the child and forms a bond with her baby.

In the past month we had a breakthrough with a pro-life physician who helps Crisis Pregnancy Centres and is also an ultrasound technician. Before the end of June, the first ultrasound machine will be purchased and placed with a pro-life physician by the Knight of Columbus in Ontario. It is our hope that this success will open the door to many more ultrasound machines and save lives.

The first Knights of Columbus Ontario **Pro-Life Sunday** is June 16. We are still able to send you copies of the bulletin insert – *Changing the World by Caring for Others*, in English and French. We can also email you a PDF of the bulletin insert and you can photocopy it.

Thank you to the many Councils who are participating in this program.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank you for your support of Special Olympics, especially during the past 12 months, as Special Olympics celebrated its 50th Anniversary and the Knights of Columbus celebrated a 50 year partnership with Special Olympics. The Knights were there from the very beginning, in Chicago in 1968 and our steadfast support for Special Olympics continues to this day.

The celebrations in Canada are not as yet over, as Special Olympics Ontario will be celebrating the 50th Anniversary of the first Canadian Special Olympics Games, which were held in Toronto on June 9, 1969 and the Knights were there too.

On March 25, 2019, the Knights were at many of the 50 cities and towns across the province to celebrate Special Olympics Day in Ontario and to help raise the Special Olympics flag at these locations.

Our Flag Relay, which serves as an umbrella for everything that we do for Special Olympics in Ontario, had 24 flags go from District to District across the province raising public awareness about Special Olympics and our ongoing support for this worthwhile cause. These signed flags had been displayed prominently at the various venues of the Special Olympics Invitational Games, which were held from May 14th to 17th in Toronto and Mississauga, and where a number of Brothers served as volunteers during these Games. The Fourth Degree participated in greeting over 2,000 athletes and coaches, along with carrying in the Special Olympics flag, during the Opening Ceremonies of the Games,

Ontario State Council, and a number of Councils, have financially supported Special Olympics in a variety of ways, which resulted in over \$50,000 being raised for Special Olympics and for the Invitational Games. Our support included participating in the Draft-an-Athlete program, which helped change the lives of a number of athletes by assisting them in covering the costs incurred while attending the Games, such as accommodations, meals and transportation. Our support was truly appreciated by the athletes and by the community.

The Special Olympics Canada Winter Games (specialolympics2020.com) will be held in Thunder Bay from February 25th to February 29th where over a 1,000 athletes, coaches and officials will be participating in eight winter sports: Cross Country Skiing, Alpine Skiing, Floor Hockey, Five-Pin Bowling, Figure Skating, Speed Skating, Curling and Snowshoeing. The Special Olympics Ontario Spring Games will be held in Waterloo Region from May 28th to 31st and will include five sports: bowling, rhythmic gymnastics, powerlifting, basketball and swimming. Volunteer and sponsorship opportunities will be available for both of these events.
